#### Who is Study Higher and what is Future Pathways?

Study Higher is part of a national widening participation partnership called <u>Uni Connect</u>. We deliver impartial outreach programmes to young people who are underrepresented in higher education; 14% of care leavers under 19 progress to higher education, compared to 47% of all other children [read more here]. Future Pathways is our programme for care-experienced young people aged 13-18, supporting them to understand their options, raise aspirations, and develop their own plans for the future. We deliver the programme across Swindon, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire in partnership with Oxford Brookes University, University of Oxford, Buckinghamshire New University, University of Reading and Royal Agricultural University.

#### **Confidence and motivation**

"I would like to either be at university or have a full time job either as a pilot or with real estate."
