What is Study Higher and why do we work with service pupils?

Study Higher is part of a national widening participation partnership called **Uni Connect**. We give impartial information to young people who are underrepresented in higher education (HE), and service pupils are one of these underrepresented groups. Service pupil education and HE progression can be adversely affected by aspects of their military lives, such as mobility and deployment. The Office for Students deems service pupils to be an at-risk group when it comes to equality of opportunity.
